But how far does this song go? Some historians point to a 1719 opera called Kingdom of the Birds, in which a character sings: In the fields in Frost and Snow, There I keep my father's cows, Boing here, Boing there, Every where a Boo, We challenge all care and struggle, In a charming country-life. In 1908, a 74-year-old woman in a London work house was recorded singing a song called The Farmyard: Up was I on my fa-ther's farm On a May day tomorrow-ing ear-ly; Feeding the cows of my fa-ther On a May morning-ing day ear-ly, With a moo moo here and a moo moo there, Here a moo, there is a moo, Here a moo, Here a pret-ty moo. Six pret-ty maidens come and gang me to the mer-ry green fields in the farm yard. In 1917, a more recognizable version was published in a collection of World War I songs: Old Macdougall had a farm in Ohio-i-o, and on that farm he had some dogs in Ohio-i-o, with an arc-wow here, and an arc-wow there, Here a bow, there a wow, everywhere an arc-wow. The most modern version simply wobbles from a variety of free-range animals with the accompanying sounds, each verse adding the previous sound to a long string until, at the end of the song, the children are mooing, neighing, barking, meowing, quacking, and clucking. The song can continue as long as the singers are patient and can think of new animals to add to the repertoire. Jumping into content With origins dating back to the 1870s Wales, This Old Man is a fairly established nursery rhyme. What is believed to be the original version was not published until 1937, however, and the version that is familiar to most of us was published in 1906. The most common version runs: This old man, played one, played knick-knack on my thumb; With a good paddywhack, this old man came rolling home. The song circulated as a way for the villagers to let the old man know they were about him, and to warn the children away from him. An even earlier version was told and published by Anne Gilchrist, who said she learned it from her Welsh nanny. With its quaint language, the lyrics are clearly earlier than the old man version, and is appropriately innocent as a children's song. More about children's music family activities to entertain everyone has always seemed very annoying when watching movies on my PC that some scenes are very loud and some scenes I can barely hear what is going on. I understand that you are trying to make it as realistic as possible, but it is really annoying if you can not raise the speakers all the way or if you are not able to use headphones. This is especially true at night or in a public place where I'm listening to something on my laptop and suddenly there's very loud dance music or loud action scenes. What do I normally do? Well, manually I turn the volume around until the loud scenes are over and then I turn the volume up again later. I have been very frustrated with this for a long time until I found a cool program called Sound Lock that works for Windows that will limit the sound output level on your computer! Basically, it's really a simple piece of software. Just tell him the maximum sound level you want and you'll make sure the volume never goes above that. But you're probably like Well, can't I just reduce the volume of my computer to 50% and it would be the same? No! So the program doesn't just lower the volume. Play quieter scenes at a normal volume and then turn down the volume if something becomes too strong. This is exactly what I wanted because I could hear the dialogues clearly, but every time a loud scene started playing, it kept the volume at the lower level that I put it too. How to use Sound Lock Once you install the software, it will appear in the system tray and if you click on it, you will see the following sound adjuster: You need to click the On button and then simply adjust the slider to the desired maximum sound output level you want. By default, it is set to the maximum level. My suggestion would be to play a movie or video, go to a strong scene and then reduce the volume to what sounds best. Then leave it there and look at the rest Video. You'll notice that as long as you don't drag the slider under the yellow bars, the volume doesn't decrease! That's the great thing about this show. The other way to do this is to play a normal scene with dialogue, for example, and and just drag the slider a little over the bars. The program works like magic! You can still hear everything in the loud scenes very well, but instead of your ears exploding, you just hear it on the same level as everything else. It does a great job of making all the audio sound very smooth. There are no big falls or jumps in the sound or anything like that. Another interesting thing is that you can adjust the volume per channel, up to 14 different channels. If you click the settings button in the top right, you can view all channels and choose the sound device. Like a note, if you download this in IE, you may receive a message saying that this program is not commonly downloaded, it can damage your computer, etc., etc. I reviewed the software in VirusTotal and it gave a 100% negative result for viruses, malware or spyware, so you don't have to worry about that. It's not a well-known program and that's why you get the message in IE. I use this program all the time, even while watching YouTube videos, home videos, songs from my music library or anything else. It just does a good job with audio and keeps everything much quieter! If you have been having the same problem with strong scenes in movies or strong sections in a song or video, this program will work wonders! Enjoy! Enjoy!
